- 1 – This subject is taught in sets based on ability.
 - 2 – Some students will study Biology, Chemistry and Physics (6 Periods). Some will study Trilogy science (also 6 Periods).
 - 3 – Students choose either Spanish or French.
 - 4 – If RE or Citizenship are chosen then the other is delivered in tutor time.
 - 5 – Optional Subjects (Students choose 1 or 2 optional subjects), A side – 4 lessons; B side – 3 lessons

Key Stage 5 – Years 12 & 13

Students choose subjects from the following list to make up 4 A Levels or equivalent:

In addition any student who does not have at least GCSE Grade C in English or Maths must also study these subjects until they reach a C Grade.

A Levels

Maths, English, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Applied Science, Further Maths, Economics, Psychology, Sociology, Geography, History, Product Design, Graphics, Art, PE, RE, Media Studies, Computing, French, Other MFL*.

BTEC Nationals

Applied Science, Engineering, Sport, Travel & Tourism, ICT, Art, Business Studies.

All BTEC Nationals are either Diplomas (2 A Level equivalent) or Extended Diplomas (3 A level equivalent)

Vocational Learning

Students who are not yet ready for A Levels or BTEC Nationals will study a suite of foundation and vocational subjects including a BTEC Level 2 in Sport, numeracy and literacy. They will normally also have one day of vocational study off site.
