
EBA Reading List - Newly Added

EBA History




John Hayward was a 20th Century stained glass artist. Born in Tooting in 1929, he attended to Bec Grammar School (now Ernest Academy) on Beechcroft Road. Inspired by his art teacher, Jack Elvin, he studied at St Martins School of Art.

In the 1950s, John Hayward designed and gifted three windows for Bec Grammar. These windows were originally installed above the entrance to Bec Grammar School.

They are now mounted above the entrance to Ernest Bevin Academy.





CCF

Sixteen students from EBA participated in a Royal Marines CCF camp this term. As part of their preparation for the camp, CCF members underwent a rigorous water survival skills assessment last week, including a Combat Swim test. During this test, the cadets had to swim 50m without touching the floor and then tread water for a specific duration, all while wearing their full uniform. Additionally, they were required to jump into the pool with webbing and a weapon, followed by independently exiting the pool. 




Curriculum Spotlight - Science

Year 7 – In their final few weeks of Science in Year 7, students will be learning about Space! A much loved topic by all students during which they will explore the answers to questions such as: where is the Earth in space? What makes up our solar system? What causes our days, years and seasons? Students will finish by linking their learning to where elements are made, and how ultimately that makes us all stardust.



Year 9 – Students have finished their end of year assessments and are now starting their GCSE content! They are starting with the Topic 'Cell Biology', which looks at the structure and different types. They will be looking at cells with a microscope and understanding how substances are transported into and out of cells.



Year 8 – This summer term there is a focus on scientists from different ethnicities, religions and sex. This allows students to be inspired by scientists who share their same background and ethnicity, and to study women's contribution in science too.

Currently students are studying the contributions of Musa Jabir Ibn Hayyan (72 - 815 AD) who is known as the father of Arab chemistry and a founder in modern pharmacy.

Later on, in the term, students will have the opportunity to research and present their own chosen key figure in Science to the class and teach others about a scientist who is of interest to them.



Year 10 – Students have finished their end of year assessments and are continuing with the GCSE syllabus. Students will be studying the topics 'Ecology' and 'Rates of reaction' until the end of the year.

Year 12 – Our students are focussing on developing their investigation and practical skills until the summer holidays.






